The MICHELIN LATITUDE Cross S2's 'Z' pattern on top of the world on 'El Condor'

For the second year in a row, the Rally Argentina threw extremely varied weather conditions at competitors, making it a huge challenge. After the opening, relatively compact, dry stages on Thursday and Friday, in quite mild temperatures, the conditions became increasingly difficult and Saturday's itinerary was cold and rainy, while Sunday turned out to be something of a nightmare, especially at the start of SS12 ('El Condor-Copina') where crews had to cope with mud and very low visibility because of fog.

Total concentration was vital in order to stay in control, but the drivers were helped by their MICHELIN LATITUDE Cross tyres, the tread pattern of which provided them with the necessary grip. "If a tread pattern isn't capable of clearing the mud, the tyre quickly becomes a slick and doesn't provide any grip whatsoever. That's why Michelin has stayed loyal to its asymmetric 'Z' tread pattern which delivers surefooted performance for competitive distances exceeding 80 kilometres, even on aggressive ground," says **Jacques MORELLI**, the manager of Michelin's rally programmes.

Despite the difficult situation, MICHELIN LATITUDE Cross S2 was in its element. Sunday's action saw Volkswagen Motorsport's Jari-Matti LATVALA and Sébastien OGIER control their lead from in front to finish first and second, while Mikko HIRVONEN pulled out all the stops to fight back with fastest times on SS11/13 ('Giulio Cesare-Mina Clavero') and SS12 ('El Condor-Copina), providing an eloquent glimpse in the process of both his talent and the exceptional potential of his Michelin tyres. The Finn's domination was only thwarted on the Power Stage by Sébastien OGIER who collected three welcome bonus points in the process.

The podium finishers in Argentina were Volkswagen Polo R WRC crews LATVALA/ANTTILA and OGIER/INGRASSIA, along with MEEKE/NAGLE in the N°3 Citroën DS3 WRC.
